WeirFoulds partner Raj Anand provided comment to Alice Chen of *The Hill Times* in an article published on April 21, 2021, on the need for widespread gender-neutral language in federal policy and legislation.

The federal justice department of Canada told *The Hill Times* that it has more recently been using 'they' as a singular gender-neutral pronoun on a piecemeal basis, but the gendered nature of the French language requires study, with a review currently underway.

Many diversity experts are also quoted in the article on the significant benefits that gender-neutral language and this type of inclusion can bring to organizations, from enhanced financial performance to improved employee engagement and innovation.

Raj points towards the *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms* and its emphasis on gender equality, noting that implementing gender-neutral language would also put into action the promise the Charter was designed to have.
