Two Important Cases for Regulatory Bodies on the Ontario *Human Rights Code* The recent Divisional Court decision of *Ontario (Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services) v. De Lottinville* considered the authority of the Human Rights Tribunal of Ontario ("Tribunal") to dismiss a human rights application where the applicant has also brought a complaint, arising out of the same facts, to a professional regulatory body. In *De Lottinville*, the Divisional Court heard together two applications for judicial review, one from a police officer and the other from a doctor, in a "test case" representing an important development in the Tribunal's jurisprudence.
