The article, "The Death Binder: Why You Need One and What to Include," highlights the importance of preparing a binder (virtual or physical) containing essential information and documentation in the event of an individual becoming incapacitated or dying, commonly known as a "death binder" or "legacy binder". Since Canada lacks a central repository of information that would be required by an attorney for property or care or an executor, this resource is essential for mitigating difficulties and costs, as well as ensuring that an individual's final wishes are properly fulfilled.

Lucy was most recently published in the [Fall 2024](#) edition alongside Associate Yatin Sidhu, where the two discussed issues that can arise when a Will is out of date or contains ambiguous drafting.
